Year 6 Medina college science lesson review

Mr Fleming from Medina College arrived in his van and said he was planning to make it into science lab. He brought meteors (assorted balls) stuff to make mini rockets and other fun stuff. We were split into groups of 4 and given 2 activity sheets per group to record our experiment results and the first experiment was to put some sand in a tray and see how big a crater each meteor would make. Next we had to make a rocket out of card and a bottle of water for the final experiment. Then we mixed 2 dry chemicals and 1 liquid chemical to make a flying chemical reaction. Finally he got out a rocket launch pad to launch our bottle rockets by building up the pressure to make it fly high in the sky. Everyone enjoyed it even if some experiments went wrong!
