On Wednesday we travelled to the mainland on the FastCat to Portsmouth Historic Dockyard, as part of our topic 'Shipwreck!'

First, we took part in a workshop where we learnt all about Henry VIII's favourite ship the Mary Rose and the people who worked on the ship, including the officers, the cook, the archers and the rest of the crew. We dressed up in rich and poor Tudor clothing, and explored the artefacts that they used. The poor members of the crew had wooden plates and jugs, while the rich officers had metal plates and jugs.

Then we visited the Mary Rose museum where we saw the Mary Rose itself (or what is left of it!) and all the artefacts that were found at the bottom of the Solent.

After lunch we toured the HMS Warrior where we learnt all about life at sea in the Victorian times. We tried sleeping in a hammock, saw a cat o' nine tails, saw how the engines worked and learnt how the crew lived on board the ship. We also saw lots of cannons and learnt how they aimed and fired them. We learnt that there were 500 men on the Mary Rose, but there were 710 men on the Warrior!

We had a fantastic day and learnt lots of interesting facts.
