What is SEND IASS?

If you're a parent/carer of a child or young person with special educational needs (SEN) or a disability, or a young person with a disability, we can help you.

We provide **free, confidential and impartial** advice, information and support on all matters relating to SEN and disabilities including social care and health issues.



We listen to your concerns and work with you to identify a planned way forward by providing you with impartial information and advice to enable you to make informed decisions about your child.

We often work with parents, but we are also able to provide a direct and separate service to young people aged 16 to 25.

Many children and young people will access advice, information and support via their parents but some children, especially older children, may want to access it separately. Under these circumstances we will work individually and impartially with the young person.

We provide:

- a telephone helpline service – 01983 825548;
- written information, also available online;
- advice and support in relation to school admissions;
- information sessions for parents/carers;
- training and workshops;
- access to an independent supporter.

- By listening to your worries and concerns and working with you to explore your options.
- Helping you to understand complex letters, reports and processes.
- Preparing, supporting and attending meetings.
- Helping you to understand what can be offered to a child or young person without an education health care plan in place.
- Supporting parents and young people during an education health care assessment.
- Providing advice and support in relation to appeals to the SEN and disability tribunal.
- Help if things go wrong, including advice on complaints and support in resolving disagreements.
