Description

A three hour workshop to consider the complex issues and dilemmas raised by, and increase participant's ability to, safeguard disabled children, both in the community and residential homes. Includes statutory guidance, including the Autism Act 2015, and how it impacts on practice. Includes understanding how children may communicate their well-being, including children without verbal communication.

Includes the issues around sexual identity and sexual relationships for children with a disability, along with managing the risks around safeguarding.
