Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a really exciting week and as our final week of term approaches Easter preparations are well underway.

On Tuesday afternoon we had a great turn out for the performances by Year 5 & 6 of their Music Technology projects. Thank you so much to all of the parents and family members who came along to support the children that had taken part in the club.

Over the past week we have held four parent forum 'Coffee & Chat' sessions, this has been a good opportunity to discuss a variety of ideas that people have brought along. During the discussions, we shared that over the Easter holidays we will be improving the playground space. We also invited parents to come along with their children to do some preparation and planting in the school garden.
