## Uniform reminder

- School logo sweatshirt or cardigan
- White polo shirt
- Grey trousers, skirt, pinafore or shorts
- Grey, white or black socks or grey tights
- Black flat soled <u>shoes</u>

• Our PE kit is: a school logo white t-shirt with blue shorts or skort (blue tracksuit bottoms in the winter months), plimsolls for Reception and Key stage 1 children and plimsolls or dark trainers for Key stage 2 children

• Hair accessories must be discreet and in school colours

<u>Earrings must be studs only</u>

• Watches may be worn; however, parents are advised that expensive items should not be worn, as the nature of school activities may lead to them being damaged or lost Nail polish and make up are not permitted and <u>long hair should be tied back</u>

Please ensure that all uniform and personal belongings are **<u>labelled</u>** with your child's name. There is a much higher chance of items being returned to their rightful owner if they are named.
