Under 11 Girls Football - Home to Wroxall

Our first match saw us up against All Saints, who took an early 4-0 lead. However, baskets from Billy (4) gave us an 8-4 advantage at half time. Scores from Finn (7) and Jago (2) continued the momentum to give us a superb 26-4 victory. The second match against Shalfleet was a much closer affair, Billy gave us a 2-0 lead at half time, before five more baskets from Finn saw us win by 12 points to 4. The third match saw another incredible scoreline as we defeated St Georges 26-0, with the points coming from Billy (3), Finn (7), Jago (1) and Zachary (2).
