UNIFORM REMINDERS

It is our belief that a school uniform: promotes a sense of pride in the school, creates a feeling of belonging, is practical and distinctive, identifies the children with the school, is not distracting in class (as fashion clothing might be), makes children feel equal to one another in terms of appearance and reflects the sense both of community and of diversity that the school takes pride in

- School logo sweatshirt or cardigan
- White polo shirt
- **Grey** trousers, skirt, pinafore or shorts
- Grey, white or black socks or grey tights
- Black flat soled shoes not trainers or sandals
- Our PE kit is: a school logo white t-shirt with blue shorts or skort (blue tracksuit bottoms in the winter months), plimsolls for Reception and Key stage 1 children and plimsolls or dark trainers for Key stage 2 children
- Hair accessories must be discreet and in school colours
- Earrings must be <u>studs only</u>
- Watches may be worn; however, parents are advised that expensive items should not be worn, as the nature of school activities may lead to them being damaged or lost

Nail polish and make up are not permitted and long hair should be tied back

Please ensure that all uniform and personal belongings are <u>labelled with your child's name</u>. There is a much higher chance of items being returned to their rightful owner if they are named.

You can purchase logoed school uniform, book bags and PE bags from the school office. We also have a stock of second hand uniform available for 50p per item.
