It has been a busy couple of sporting weeks for Year 5 & 6 who have taken part in two football matches as well as their cluster Tag Rugby tournament.

First up was the Tag Rugby competition, where we entered two teams to play against St Saviours, Shalfleet, All Saints and Yarmouth.
