## Reading



Your RWI book will be changed on Mondays and Thursdays. When you are reading your book, make sure that you talk about what is happening, who the characters are, how they are feeling, what information the text is telling you, what type of book it is and so on. Please ensure that your reading record is signed and your parents have written a comment about your reading so we know you have read and talked about the book at home.



## Rewards, sanctions and Golden Worship



We have worked together to draw up class rules with rewards and sanctions. As before, your parents and other members of the family are very welcome to join us for our weekly whole school Golden Worship on Friday mornings at 8.35am, during which we celebrate achievements and progress in and out of school.
