







English	Maths
<p>Wolves will be the focus in English for most of this half term. Beginning with the traditional tale of the Three Little Pigs and a modern alternative we will use these to write the pig's diaries and a newspaper report on the incident. We will then move onto non-fiction writing about grey wolves – finding out about their lifestyle and environment and consider how they are portrayed in folklore around the world.</p> <p>In guided reading we will continue to enjoy listening to and studying Philip Pullman's "Grimm Tales." These will then guide us to create our own "traditional" tale. Finally we will delve deep into our rich and persuasive vocabulary to create an accompanying letter for the recipient of our Christmas Stocking.</p> <p>Handwriting will also be a focus – hopefully perfecting and fine tuning our joins and presentation. Who will be the first to earn their "Pen Licence?" that will allow them to write in pen in their English & Topic books.</p>	<p>We begin this half term revisiting equivalent fractions – recognizing, comparing & converting before moving onto percentages; understanding the concept and relating amounts to fractions and decimals. After that, we will move onto time – focusing on timetable, before finishing with mass and capacity.</p> <p>We will check in every now and again with Doodle Maths and Times Tables Rockstars to see how everyone is getting on with them at home.</p> <p>Alongside all of this, Mr Goldsmith will be preparing the children for entry into the "Golf Dice" championships!</p>
