

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
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News from the classrooms Robertson Class

Robertson class have been reading The Lost Words. This text is a collection of beautiful poems that were written in response to the removal of everyday nature words - among them "acorn", "bluebell", "kingfisher" and "wren" - from a widely used children's dictionary, because those words were not being used enough by children to merit inclusion.

The children have been reading and enjoying the poems, exploring the vocabulary and images.

They then created 'blackout poetry' from the introduction. They thought about how they wanted the reader to feel, and identified the words that they wanted to include in their poem. They then 'blacked out' the text that they didn't want to use. Here are a few examples. I think you will agree that the words and phrases that are left have created very effective and moving poems.

Our Vision Statement


We provide a collaborative and nurturing environment with a supportive Christian ethos where everyone is enabled to thrive and flourish in their own unique way.


As a school community, we are exploring our vision statement in more detail. Each week we will focus on a different aspect of it. So far we have focused on 'collaborative' and 'nurturing'.
