This week's Collective Worship focus is: Trinity—God's Never Ending Love

We learnt that Trinity begins on Trinity Sunday, which is celebrated on the Sunday after Pentecost. This year it was Sunday 30th May. The season of Trinity lasts until the start of Advent. The liturgical colour for Trinity is green because it is the season of growth.

We explored the word 'trinity' and wondered what it meant. We noticed that it starts with 'tri' meaning 'three' and thought of other words that start with 'tri', including triceratops, tricycle, triplets, trio, triathlon.













We then explored the Celtic knot and how it helps us to think about the mystery of the Holy Trinity. It shows three equal parts: God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. We noticed that the knot is never ending, representing God's never ending love.



We also looked at examples of Celtic crosses, that represent God's never ending love. There are some examples in St Mary's Churchyard and on Tennyson Down—can you spot them?

- · 1 emotion you feel

This is called GROUNDING - it can help when you feel like you've gone too far in your head and lost all control of your surroundings.
