Collective Worship: <u>Respect</u>


This week's Collective Worship focus is: Valuing special places










Think about your special place. Where is it? Why is it special? How do you feel when you are there? Is it anyone else's special place, or just your own?





The raffle will be taking place on Monday and prizes given to the children to bring home.




We provide a collaborative and nurturing environment with a supportive Christian ethos where everyone is enabled to thrive and flourish in their own unique way.

It's coming home!!




