Dear parents, carers and children,



Yesterday, the whole school took part in the Remembrance Day service at the memorial outside St Mary's Church. They made us very proud for the way they conducted themselves so sensibly, and sang so beautifully, during the commemorations. Representatives from each class also laid wreaths that their classes had made. We welcomed Reg Hunt and Craig Eccleston-Todd into our Collective Worship before the service, who told us about what the piper represents, as well as telling us about the new memorial bench in the churchyard, that depicts soldiers returning wearily from war to be greeted by a nurse. The silhouette of the nurse depicts a local lady who was a nurse during the First World War, and the silhouette of the horse is that of Warrior, the horse from Mottistone. The children enjoyed finding out about this. Thank you to all those who took part in the commemorations yesterday, and to those who have donated money for the Poppy Appeal.



Next week, we will be celebrating Inter Faith week. As part of this week, we will be welcoming some Christian, Jewish, Muslim and Hindu visitors into school, and finding out about their faith, different religious celebrations and more. Look out for photos on Facebook.

THE CHALLENGE

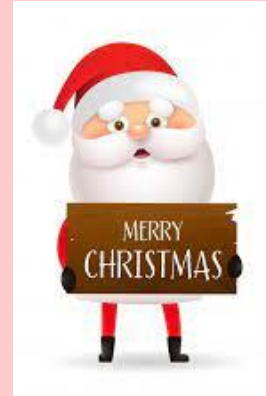
