

<p>Wolves will be the focus in English for most of this half term. Beginning with the traditional tale of the Three Little Pigs and a modern alternative, we will use these to write the pig's diaries and a newspaper report on the incident. We will then move onto non-fiction writing about grey wolves – finding out about their lifestyle and environment and consider how they are portrayed in folklore around the world, before finally inviting you to hear us presenting speeches at the “Wolf Appreciation Society”.</p> <p>In Guided Reading, we will continue to enjoy listening to and studying Philip Pullman’s “Grimm Tales”. At the end of term, we will delve deep into our rich and emotive vocabulary to create an accompanying letter for the recipient of our Christmas Stocking.</p>				<p>We begin this half term by looking at percentages – recognising their fraction and decimal equivalents, calculating 10% and 1%, then using all of these facts to solve problems. We will then move onto geometry – finding the diameter and radius of a circle and using a protractor to measure angles of shapes. We will look at telling the time and measurement before finally returning to calculating using the four operations.</p>
