<p><u>Angela McAllister - Winter's Child and Leon and the Place Between</u> We are looking at two books written by Angela McAllister. Leon and the Place Between has a circus theme, so we will be giving the children some circus experiences and a circus skills workshop. We will be practising our descriptive writing, learning how to weave similes and metaphors into our narratives in order to create particular images for the reader. We will also be developing our performance skills, focusing on intonation and tone of voice to capture the reader's interest. We will perform our final written pieces to the opposite class for peer feedback.</p> <p><u>Salvatore Rubbino - A Walk in Paris</u> Linking with our Geography theme, we will be reading a text that follows a nonfiction mixed with narrative about a trip to France. We are going to focus on how the nonfiction text is combined with narrative. The children will create their own nonfiction piece about a landmark on the island. They will find out their own facts and organise them in a logical layout.</p> 		<p><u>Money</u> - We will be making different combinations of coins to create a given amount, working out totals of amounts and the correct amount of change needed. We will estimate and compare amounts. We convert between pounds and pence.</p>  <p><u>Fractions</u> - We will show understanding that a denominator determines how an amount or object is divided into equal parts. We will add and subtract fractions with common denominators. We will compare fractions, finding equivalent fractions within amounts and pictures. We will learn to count up and down in tenths and hundredths. We will recognise and write fractions and decimal equivalents. We will compare and order decimal numbers.</p> <p><u>Geometry</u> - We will be recognising, drawing, and modelling 2D and 3D shapes. We will compare and classify 3D shapes. We will recognise the types of angles and their properties. We will identify lines of symmetry in 2D shapes. We will learn how to draw 2D shapes by plotting given coordinates on a grid.</p> <p><u>Statistics</u> - We will be learning how to interpret tables such as bar charts, pictograms and line charts. We will unpick how to use these to interpret relevant data and other key aspects of this.</p>

<p><u>Year 3: Animals and Humans</u> We will learn that food contains a range of different nutrients that are needed by the body to stay healthy. We will look at skeletons and muscles which help movement and provide protection and support.</p> <p><u>Year 4: Sound</u> We will identify how sounds are made and how it travels to our ears through a medium, in order that we can then hear it. We will investigate the difference between pitch and volume and look for patterns amongst the features of the object that produced it. The children will be able to relate their own experiences of learning musical instruments, to our science learning.</p> <p><u>Year 5: Properties and materials -</u> We will be identifying the different types of material which are around us. We will compare and identify which materials are the best insulators. We will identify which substances dissolve and which are insoluble.
