### Y5 Science

Yesterday, in Science, Year 5 dissected some flowers - lilies and tulips (which are monocots) and peonies (which are dicots). Monocots have parallel veins running through their leaves whereas veins on a dicot's leaves will branch out in different directions. We were identifying the different parts of a flower and got particularly excited yesterday because we discovered some seeds inside one of the flower's ovule when we opened it up!
