Collective Worship - Service


This week's Collective Worship focus is: Trinity—Seeing the Truth

How can you tell? What are the clues?







NHS urges summer safety awareness to keep children out of danger

NHS services are urging local people to be more alert to risks associated with warm weather this summer.

NHS Frimley Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), which plans and funds the majority of health services provided to local people, are supporting a summer safety video, entitled 'Keep your kids live and kicking this summer'.

The video highlights the risks of leaving babies and infants unsupervised near water or open windows, particularly when parents and carers can be distracted.

Babies and infants need constant supervision around water – whether this is in the bath, paddling or swimming pool, by ponds, rivers or lakes. They also need supervision around open windows.

Debbie Hartrick, the CCG's Director for Safeguarding, said: "While incidents of drowning or near drowning are rare, it is really important that the safety of infants and children around water and open windows remains at the forefront of our minds, especially with the warmer days ahead.

"Pools, ponds and baths can keep your kids cool in the hot weather. However, water can also be dangerous for children if parents and carers don't pay attention.

"With more and more families still spending more time at home due to Covid-19, we know that children will be playing in garden paddling pools and it's important that they do so safely."

She added: "Young children can drown in less than two inches (six centimetres) of water, in only 20 seconds. If they are very young, you won't even hear them. They can slip under the water without making a splash or a sound.

"Young children don't understand that a fall can kill them – just as they don't understand that water can kill them."

"Getting distracted by a mobile phone, talking to other people, or wandering off when your child is around water can lead to tragedy.

"By spreading these key messages, we can all help to keep our young children live and kicking this summer."

The video was first launched by commissioners in the east of Berkshire in 2017 and has been widely shared over the years.



Notice to Parents/Carers about Applying for Secondary School Transport Starting from Academic Year 2022/23

Upcoming Deadline: 26th June 2022.

Dear Parent/Carer

If you think your child is eligible for free Home to School Transport, please complete the relevant application form 'Application for Free Home to School Transport' or 'Application for Free Home to School Transport - Low income' in order to have transport in place for your child for the start of the new academic year 2022/23. Please complete your form by the deadline of **26**th **June 2022**. Should your application be received after this date, transport may not be in place for the start of the new year.

Privilege Seat Application Window – Academic Year 2022/2023

This notice applies to those parents of current year 6 students who are moving up to secondary school next year and wish to apply for a place on a Council-contracted school bus service.

Dear Parent/Guardian

The dates for the privilege seat application window for academic year 2022 have been finalised. Should you wish to apply for a privilege seat for your child to use the school bus service you will need to apply between **9am on Monday 27th June 2022 and 4pm on Friday 8th July 2022.** Please note that the online form will only be live between the above times and that applications received outside of this window will not be accepted.

If you scroll to the bottom of the above webpage you will see the bus services for which you can apply. **This information will be live from 9am on Monday 27**th **June 2022**. Should the service you require not be listed you will not be able to apply for that service at this time.

Do bear in mind that making an application for a privilege seat does not guarantee a seat on the school bus.

Privilege seat ticket prices are set costs as follows.

Up to a full term £130.00 Up to half a term £65.00 Up to a full term AM or PM only £65.00 Up to half a term AM or PM only £32.50

Important Points to Note

- There will only be 1 application window before the start of the academic year so please ensure you apply during this window for your child to be considered for a seat.
- Information on bus services that can be offered will be available on the website from 9am on Monday 27th June 2022.
- We may not be able to provide an update on the number of seats available before the application window opens but please be aware seats availability will be very limited.
- There is be a strict payment deadline for making payment. Should you miss this deadline, the seat offered to your child will be offered to the next child on the waiting list (should one exist) and your application will be cancelled.
- Once applications have been processed by the Transport Team you will be able to see the status of your application online as well as make payment without having to contact the Council.
