It has been a busy week this week!

Koala and Polar Bear classes had a visit from the school nurse about good dental hygiene. They learnt about brushing their teeth thoroughly using a circular action and timing themselves with an app to make sure that they brush for a full 2 minutes. They also talked about how to take care of their teeth by making sure they ate a healthy diet and only had treat foods occasionally. Part of this can also be helped by providing water in their bottles, rather than squash.

Years R, 3, 4, and 5 created some artwork for a **Red Funnel project** "Journey to the Island" where they are transforming the Red Funnel terminals into an underwater spectacle for the Isle of Wight Festival. The children had a fabulous HIVE day today! To develop their independence and resilience, we focus on the 5 Bs (Brain, Buddy, Boss, Board and Book) and today we introduced a sixth B: Brave! The children took part in lots of challenges today to help them with their 5 Bs, as well as with teamwork and 'the power of yet'. On Wednesday, we welcomed the team from Open the Book and SWAY, who acted out the story of The Storm on the Lake from the Bible, along with some children helpers! Open the Book offers primary school children an opportunity to hear key Bible stories told by a team of Christians from local churches, who present the stories during acts of collective worship. Following the story, the children asked questions about what happened and what the main message of the story might be about. We discussed how we can deal with any worries or anxieties by using different strategies, including thinking of 'nice things'.

We also talked about how you could also ask Jesus to help you with any worries or anxieties you may have, and he will 'calm the storm'. On the same day, children from Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, along with some of their family members, enjoyed a fun afternoon of Messy Church at The Methodist Church. They Focused on God's wonderful world, and the sea and sea creatures in particular. They decorated biscuits, created a beach scene using found materials, wrote thank you prayers and printed colour pictures. See photos on Facebook. Thank you to all the organisers and volunteers. We hope that Open the Book and Messy Church will become a regular feature at Brighstone!

This week, your child will have brought home their own Platinum Jubilee book, provided by the government. We hope you enjoy looking through it together.

I look forward to seeing some of you, including all the country dancers, at Shorwell Midsummer Fair tomorrow. I hope you all have a fantastic weekend, and I look forward to seeing you on Monday.

This week we talked about telling the whole story. We learnt that, when people give evidence in court, they have to promise to say the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth.








School Dinners

NHS urges summer safety awareness to keep children out of danger

NHS services are urging local people to be more alert to risks associated with warm weather this summer.

NHS Frimley Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), which plans and funds the majority of health services provided to local people, are supporting a summer safety video, entitled <u>'Keep your kids live and kicking this summer'</u>.

The video highlights the risks of leaving babies and infants unsupervised near water or open windows, particularly when parents and carers can be distracted.

Babies and infants need constant supervision around water – whether this is in the bath, paddling or swimming pool, by ponds, rivers or lakes. They also need supervision around open windows.

Debbie Hartrick, the CCG's Director for Safeguarding, said: "While incidents of drowning or near drowning are rare, it is really important that the safety of infants and children around water and open windows remains at the forefront of our minds, especially with the warmer days ahead.

"Pools, ponds and baths can keep your kids cool in the hot weather. However, water can also be dangerous for children if parents and carers don't pay attention.

"With more and more families still spending more time at home due to Covid-19, we know that children will be playing in garden paddling pools and it's important that they do so safely."

She added: "Young children can drown in less than two inches (six centimetres) of water, in only 20 seconds. If they are very young, you won't even hear them. They can slip under the water without making a splash or a sound.

"Young children don't understand that a fall can kill them – just as they don't understand that water can kill them."

"Getting distracted by a mobile phone, talking to other people, or wandering off when your child is around water can lead to tragedy.

"By spreading these key messages, we can all help to keep our young children live and kicking this summer."

The video was first launched by commissioners in the east of Berkshire in 2017 and has been widely shared over the years.







All proceedings will go to Sight for Wight, the Isle of Wight charity that supports people and their families who are affected by sight loss.



Privilege Seat Application Window – Academic Year 2022/2023

This notice applies to those parents of current year 6 students who are moving up to secondary school next year and wish to apply for a place on a Council-contracted school bus service.

Dear Parent/Guardian

The dates for the privilege seat application window for academic year 2022 have been finalised. Should you wish to apply for a privilege seat for your child to use the school bus service you will need to apply between **9am on Monday 27th June 2022 and 4pm on Friday 8th July 2022.** Please note that the online form will only be live between the above times and that applications received outside of this window will not be accepted.

Please also note the FAQs, Code of Good Practice and Ticket Terms and Conditions sections available via this webpage.

If you scroll to the bottom of the above webpage you will see the bus services for which you can apply. **This information will be live from 9am on Monday 27th June 2022**. Should the service you require not be listed you will not be able to apply for that service at this time.

Do bear in mind that making an application for a privilege seat does not guarantee a seat on the school bus.

Privilege seat ticket prices are set costs as follows.

Up to a full term £130.00 Up to half a term £65.00 Up to a full term AM or PM only £65.00 Up to half a term AM or PM only £32.50

Important Points to Note

- There will only be 1 application window before the start of the academic year so please ensure you apply during this window for your child to be considered for a seat.

- Information on bus services that can be offered will be available on the website from **9am on Monday 27th June 2022**.

- We may not be able to provide an update on the number of seats available before the application window opens but please be aware seats availability will be very limited.

- There is be a strict payment deadline for making payment. Should you miss this deadline, the seat offered to your child will be offered to the next child on the waiting list (should one exist) and your application will be cancelled.

- Once applications have been processed by the Transport Team you will be able to see the status of your application online as well as make payment without having to contact the Council.
