### Grammar and Spelling Matters

Each week we will include a mini grammar or spelling lesson so you know what your children are learning!

#### Kennings

#### What is a Kenning poem?

- ❖ A Kenning poem is a riddle poem entirely made up of two-word metaphors.
- ❖ This form of poetry comes from Viking and Norse cultures. They would often name their weapons with a metaphor: e.g. 'long claw' or 'bone breaker'.

#### Kennings Rules

What is the poem about?

Kennings describe what a person, idea or object is or does.

Each line is a simple phrase of either a noun + a noun OR a noun + a verb.

They work like a riddle - you have to guess what it's all about!

We use kennings in our everyday language, such as 'big-scraper' for a very tall building.

If you are creating a noun + a verb phrase, your verb may end in 'ing', e.g. rollerblade-rolling.

If you are creating a noun + a noun phrase, try adding 'er' to the second noun, e.g. cheese-wheeler.

**Kennings**

A kenning is a form of metaphor, originally used in Anglo-Saxon and Norse poetry.

In a kenning, an object is described in a two-word phrase, such as 'whale-road' for 'ship'.

Some kennings can be more obscure than others, and are often to bring a smile!


Summer Reading Challenge 2022

## GADGETEERS

At Brighstone Library (and others!) this summer!

The **Summer Reading Challenge**, presented by The Reading Agency, is delivered in partnership with public libraries and funded by Arts Council England. The Challenge encourages children aged 4 to 11 to enjoy the benefits of reading for pleasure over the summer holidays, providing lots of fun as well as helping to prevent the summer reading 'dip'.

Each year the Challenge motivates over 700,000 children to keep reading to build their skills and confidence.



This year's Summer Reading Challenge theme is **Gadgeteers**, created in partnership with [Science Museum Group](#) and illustrated by top children's writer and illustrator Julian Beresford.

This year's theme 'Gadgeteers' will spark children's curiosity about the world around them. With resources and activities from the Science Museum Group, the Challenge focuses on inspiring children to see the science and innovation behind everyday objects, showing that reading and science are for everyone.


The Challenge and the accompanying book collection will show that imagination can unlock endless possibilities, and the library is where this starts. Through taking part in the Challenge, with free packs from public libraries or on the children's website, children will be able to join six fictional 'Gadgeteers.'

The characters use their curiosity and wonder to understand the science behind a whole range of interests from fashion and technology to cooking and music.



## NHS urges summer safety awareness to keep children out of danger

NHS services are urging local people to be more alert to risks associated with warm weather this summer.

NHS Frimley Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), which plans and funds the majority of health services provided to local people, are supporting a summer safety video, entitled [‘Keep your kids live and kicking this summer’](#).

The video highlights the risks of leaving babies and infants unsupervised near water or open windows, particularly when parents and carers can be distracted.

Babies and infants need constant supervision around water – whether this is in the bath, paddling or swimming pool, by ponds, rivers or lakes. They also need supervision around open windows.

Debbie Hartrick, the CCG’s Director for Safeguarding, said: “While incidents of drowning or near drowning are rare, it is really important that the safety of infants and children around water and open windows remains at the forefront of our minds, especially with the warmer days ahead.

“Pools, ponds and baths can keep your kids cool in the hot weather. However, water can also be dangerous for children if parents and carers don’t pay attention.

“With more and more families still spending more time at home due to Covid-19, we know that children will be playing in garden paddling pools and it’s important that they do so safely.”

She added: “Young children can drown in less than two inches (six centimetres) of water, in only 20 seconds. If they are very young, you won’t even hear them. They can slip under the water without making a splash or a sound.

“Young children don’t understand that a fall can kill them – just as they don’t understand that water can kill them.”

“Getting distracted by a mobile phone, talking to other people, or wandering off when your child is around water can lead to tragedy.

“By spreading these key messages, we can all help to keep our young children live and kicking this summer.”

The video was first launched by commissioners in the east of Berkshire in 2017 and has been widely shared over the years.
