Dear parents, carers and children,

Over the last couple of weeks we have trialled a new **gate opening time** of 8.20am for a number of reasons. The decision has been made to keep to this revised time. However, you are welcome to drop your children off at either the back gate where I will greet them, or the front gate where Mrs Jones will now stand to greet them, for them to walk through the school site independently. If you still wish to accompany your children to the classroom door, please continue to use the one way system through the Warnes Lane entrance. Our Breakfast Club (ran by Brighstone Preschool), for those who need to drop off their children early, is open from 7.30am and costs £4.50. It also has a special offer of £2.25 for 8am—8.25am. If you have any questions, please contact the school office.

We recognise that sometimes you may wish to **inform the class teacher** of something when you drop off your child. To enable the class teacher to greet each child personally (as part of our wellbeing approach and to increase the children's sense of belonging) and to supervise the class, we ask that you pass your messages onto myself, Mrs Jones or Mrs Pelosi in the office. Alternatively, you can email the class teacher if your message isn't urgent, and they will respond within a couple of working days. We thank you for your understanding in this.



Our first **'Share a Story'** session took place today in Bumble Bee class. It was lovely to see so many parents and carers come along to enjoy a book with their children. The dates for the other classes are on p6 of the Buzz.

We are excited to let you know that we are planning another event in which parents and carers can come along to enjoy activities with their children. Punctuation

COLON
VS
SEMICOLON

Colons and semicolons were initially used to express pauses longer than a comma and shorter than a period. A semicolon consists of a dot above a comma (;), while a colon is a punctuation mark consisting of two dots one over the other (:).

COLON :

1. Introduce lists, series, quotations and explanations.
 - He was going to buy three things: chairs, tables, and utensils.
 - John wrote: "I wish you a merry Christmas. All affection and best wishes to you and yours."
2. Separate independent clauses.
 - They will not make it: the storm is too strong.
3. Show emphasis.
 - He was there for one person: his mother.
 - You have two choices: finish the work today or lose the contract.
4. Separate units of time.
 - Sophia set her alarm clock for 6:30 a.m.

SEMICOLON ;

1. Between items in a list or series when the items themselves contain commas.
 - There are eight members on the team: two from China and Japan; three from France and Spain; two from Brazil and Chile; and one from India.
 - We visited Thailand, Vietnam, and Singapore in the spring; Germany, France, and Italy in the summer; and South Africa in the fall.
2. Separate two independent clauses while still demonstrating that a close relationship exists between them.
 - They came all the way home; even so, they all knew they had to go back once more.
 - My daughter is a teacher; my son is a doctor.

IMPORTANCE OF A ROUTINE



Reduced Stress



1. Routines eliminate power struggles

Routines eliminate power struggles because you are not bossing the child around. This activity (brushing teeth, napping, and turning off the TV to come to dinner) is just what we do at this time of day. The parent stops being the bad guy, and nagging is greatly reduced.

2. Routines help kids cooperate

Routines help kids cooperate by reducing stress and anxiety for everyone. We all know what comes next, we get fair warning for transitions, and no one feels pushed around, or like their parents are being arbitrary.

3. Routines help kids learn to take charge of their own activities

Over time, kids learn to brush their teeth, pack their backpacks, etc., without constant reminders. Kids love being in charge of themselves. This feeling increases their sense of mastery and competence. Kids who feel more independent and in charge of themselves have less need to rebel and be oppositional.

4. Kids learn the concept of "looking forward" to things they enjoy...

...which is an important part of making a happy accommodation with the demands of a schedule. He may want to go to the park now, but he can learn that we always go to the park in the afternoon, and he can look forward to it then.

5. Regular routines help kids get on a schedule

Regular routines help kids get on a schedule, so that they fall asleep more easily at night.

6. Schedules help parents maintain consistency in expectations.

If everything is a fight, parents end up settling: more TV, skip brushing teeth for tonight, etc. With a routine, parents are more likely to stick to healthy expectations for everyone in the family, because that is just the way we do things in our household. The result: a family with healthy habits, where everything runs more smoothly!
