Dear parents, carers and children,
Monday saw the thousands of people all around the world watch the funeral of our late Queen Elizabeth. It was a very moving day that we will remember for years to come. We were very proud to find out that one of our ex pupils, Angus Bellamy, was one of the Royal Navy sailors who pulled the gun carriage bearing the Queen's coffin. What an honour that must have been.

Last Saturday saw our annual Round the Island Relay Race against Nine Acres Primary School. For those taking part, and those following their progress on Facebook, it was a very exciting day! We were determined to win, and we are delighted to say that we won by over half an hour.
