Dear parents, carers and children,

The children made us all very proud today when they sang as part of the Remembrance Service outside St Mary's Church. Their behaviour was exemplary and we received a lot of positive feedback. The service was an emotional time for many, especially those who are directly affected by the current war in Ukraine. Our thoughts and prayers are with them.





This morning, Mrs Johnstone talked to the children about the School Council and about the im-School Council and about the importance of pupil voice. Pupil voice gives learners the opportunity to play an active role in decisions that affect them. They can plan and review the actions they have taken as well as taking responsibility for how this will happen. Unicef states that "Article 12 - Respect for the child's views:

When adults make decisions that affect children, children have the right to say what they think should happen and that their views are taken into account." Last year we had our Eco-Council, and this year we have the EARA group as well as our new forthcoming School Council. Children will have the opportunity to put their names forward to be council representatives, and a 'blind' vote will take place in each class. When asked who might be interested, almost the whole school put up their hands! This is fantastic, as I know that our children have so many ideas.

We are welcoming in a range of Inter Faith visitors of different faiths throughout the week who will be talking about celebrations and David Randini will be presenting shows about road safety. part in a Q&A session with Ivy Bee class who have been learning about monarchy and parliament. To finish a very busy week, we will be celebrating Children in Need day on Friday 18th. Children are invited to come into school in yellow and/or spotty clothing and accessories in return for a donation.






