Dear parents, carers and children,

What a busy week we have had! In amongst our usual lessons, we have been finishing off assessments, welcoming visitors to our school, learning about road safety, Y3 visited Dinosaur Isle and we raised money for Children in Need. All these activities help to develop the 'whole child', helping them to become aware of the community and the world around them, as well as developing a wide range of skills.

On Monday, as part of UK Parliament Week, **Bob Seely MP**, visited our school. He started off with a tour led by the Y6 SLT (well done Felicity, Alfie and Lauren!), followed by a Q&A session with Y5/6. This visit supported their History unit of work about monarchy and parliament. The children asked some really good questions about what it was like being an MP, including "When and why did you become an MP?", "What do you enjoy about politics?", "What sort of decisions do MPs have to make?", "What is the most important debate you have been part of?", "Has the government ever made a decision you didn't agree with?" and "Why do MPs shout so much in the House of Commons?" Y6 hope to be able to have a tour of the Houses of Parliament when they visit London in the summer term for their residential trip.



Tuesday brought a visit from **David Randini**, who presented a fun show about road safety. The giggles and roars of laughter coming down the corridor were a delight to hear, and the children are now more aware of how to keep safe around roads.



Throughout this week, as part of **Inter Faith week**, we have welcomed visitors of different faiths, who talked to us about religious festivals. We heard about lots of Hindu festivals, including Holi and Diwali, sampled delicious Indian food, danced to Indian music, heard a Jewish song while learning about Hanukkah and the Maccabees, heard how Methodists and Anglicans celebrate the Christian festivals of Christmas and Easter, and made Eid cards as part of the Muslim festival of Eid-ul-Fitr. We would like to say a huge thank you to Mike, Reverend Jackie, Jonathon and Muhammed, and an especially big thank you to Avy and his mum Sunitha, who we were delighted to see again. Cllr Andre and Cllr Critchison also visited us as they were very interested in seeing our Inter Faith week in action. Photos of these activities will be in next week's Buzz.

How well do you know the actions to 'Superman', 'Macarena', 'I am the Music Man' and 'Cha Cha Slide'?! The children enjoyed dancing along to these, and more, as part of our Dance-a-long' this morning for **Children in Need**. So far, we have raised over £100! Well done to everyone who donated. You all looked wonderful in your yellow and spotty clothes!



A very proud Mr Stroud came to get me this afternoon, inviting me to listen to the **Y3 children** in their brass lesson. I am not surprised he was so enthusiastic and proud of them; they played wonderfully and could explain about the different notes that they had to read. Well done, Y3!

"Reading is the gateway that makes all other learning possible." **Reading** is an invaluable part of learning and enjoyment, and children are encouraged to read at every opportunity: reading to find out new information and reading for pleasure. It is also really beneficial for children to listen to stories read to them, whatever their age. We ask if you (or your child) can write in their reading record every time they have read, so we can keep track as well. Many thanks.

Collective Worship - Compassion

This week's Collective Worship focus is 'Putting on the right attitude'.

What does the word 'compassion' mean?

The word **compassion** is a combination of two words:

- 'com' which means 'with'
- 'passion' which can sometimes mean 'suffering'

Compassion therefore means being with someone who is suffering or sad, trying to understand how they might be feeling and showing that you care about them.

We talked about putting on the attitudes of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

Punctuation—Exclamation Marks

Exclamation Marks

Exclamation marks are used to indicate strong feelings or a raised voice in speech:

"Go away!" she shouted at him.

"Help!"

"Good heavens!" he said. "Is that true?"

"What a beautiful smile you have!" exclaimed the dentist.

"Be quiet!"

"What a fantastic house you have!" he exclaimed.

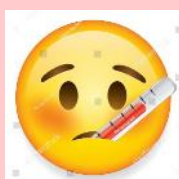
Exclamation marks are also used at the end of exclamation sentences, which start with 'what' or 'who' and contain a verb.

Avoid using exclamation marks too much or they will lose their impact.

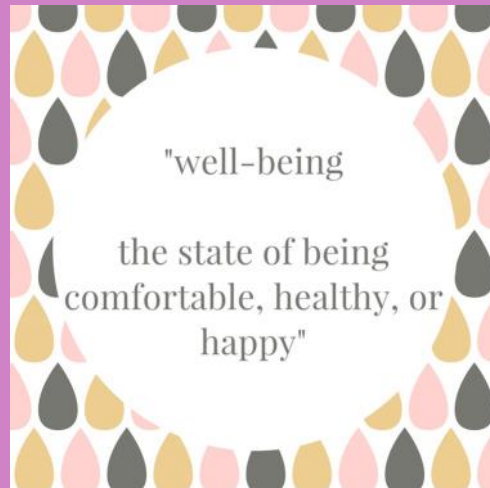

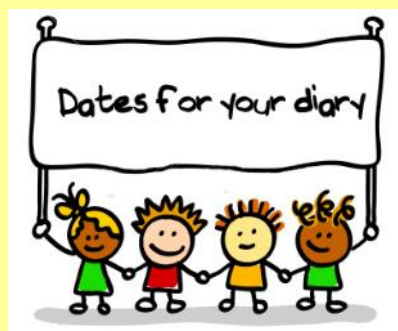

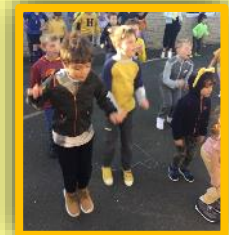


Reception Hand Washing
