Dear parents, carers and children,

Change is afoot this week! The children have been very excited to see our amazing new **trim trail** on the school field. We can't wait to use it once the field dries out a bit (it's been very wet over the past few weeks). Trim trails are great for encouraging imaginative play, developing perseverance, improving cognitive ability, developing core strength and agility, gross motor skills and balance and coordination. Furthermore, the physical activity gained from this type of activity can be beneficial for children's mental health, helping to improve self-esteem, and reduce stress and anxiety. Who would have thought a trim trail could do so much!



The **EARA group** have also been busy planning improvements. They have created 'task force' groups with a different focus for each. One group have identified a need to develop our Quiet Zone in the playground (in the wooden summer house), so they have decided that beanbags, cushions, sensory toys, books and hanging baskets are just the ticket to ensure that it becomes a quiet, safe and welcoming space for those who need it. Two of the EARA group are drawing up a rota of members to monitor the correct use of the space (no running) and to provide support to those who need it. Watch this space!



Another 'task force' within the EARA group have decided that we need a greater range of diverse and inclusive books, so have been making some recommendations and carrying out research. We have received some books on approval which the EARA group explored today, making their choices on which books they think look enticing! Next week, six representatives from the EARA group will be visiting Gatten and Lake Primary School to meet with other schools' representatives and present our actions so far. Thank you, EARA group, for all your ideas and hard work.



Another thank you to the **School Council** who met today. They discussed a range of topics, including the development and use of the school garden, the classroom learning environments and making compost from food waste. I look forward to seeing your ideas come to fruition.

I am very proud of our children who contribute thoughtful and insightful ideas to our discussions on how to make our school even better!


#### **Grammar and Spelling Matters**



#### **Honey Bee Class**


In Y3/4, they have been reading The Iron Man by Ted Hughes. They have been learning how to improve sentences.

#### Privilege Seat Application Window – Academic Year 2022/2023

Dear Parent/Guardian

The dates for the privilege seat application window for academic year 2022 have been finalised. Should you wish to apply for a privilege seat for your child to use the school bus service you will need to apply from 9am on Tuesday 6th December 2022 Please note that the online form will be live until on or around 5th June 2023

Please also note the FAQs, Code of Good Practice and Ticket Terms and Conditions sections available via this webpage. If you scroll to the bottom of the above webpage, you will see the bus services for which you can apply. This information

will be live from 9am on Tuesday 6th December 2022. Should the service you require not be listed you will not be able to apply for that service at this time.

Do bear in mind that making an application for a privilege seat does not guarantee a seat on the school bus.

Privilege seat ticket prices are set costs as follows.

- Up to a full term £130.00
- Up to half a term £65.00
- Up to a full-term AM or PM only £65.00
- Up to half a term AM or PM only £32.50

#### Important Points to Note

- Information on bus services that can be offered will be available on the website from 9am on Tuesday 6th December 2022

- We may not be able to provide an update on the number of seats available before the application window opens but please be aware seats availability will be very limited.

Services available are listed at the bottom of the Privilege seat webpage

- There will be a strict payment deadline for making payment. Should you miss this deadline, the seat offered to your child will be offered to the next child on the waiting list (should one exist) and your application will be cancelled.

-Once applications have been processed by the Transport Team you will be able to see the status of your application online as well as make payment without having to contact the Council.
