This week's Collective Worship theme is **Respect—Valuing Special Places**







Online misogyny is a very real issue right now

Misogyny is form of online hate that targets women and girls. It's promoted in different communities online where influencers promote a narrative that women should be treated as less than men.



Schools across the UK have found increasing numbers of boys and young men using online influencers as role models.

This isn't always a bad thing, but there are influencers who display harmful behaviour. This includes misogyny, violence against women and minorities, and sexual misconduct.

We have been asked to share this information from Public Health with parents:

UKHSA have published a <u>press release</u> to encourage parents to check their child's vaccinations are up to date before they travel abroad this summer. Particularly their measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccinations, especially before they travel this summer and before attending summer festivals where measles can spread more easily.

Measles is now circulating in many countries around the world and the World Health Organisation has warned that Europe is likely to see a resurgence unless countries catch-up children who missed out.

During the COVID-19 pandemic there was a fall in uptake for the routine childhood vaccinations in the UK, including MMR, which leaves communities vulnerable to outbreaks, especially as people travel abroad for summer holidays to places where measles is more common.

Measles is highly infectious and can lead to serious problems such as pneumonia, meningitis and on rare occasions long term disability or death.

Please contact your GP to check.

These vaccinations can be given at any age – it is not too late to vaccinate.

Y2 Havenstreet Visit

On Thursday, Y2 visited the Steam Railway at Havenstreet to take part in a workshop about "Holidays on the Garden Isle" in times gone by. Looking at old photographs, the children recalled all of their learning about holidays and especially bathing machines.

The children learnt that trams once went down Ryde pier - then they saw one out on the track and they got to sit on the other one in the Train Story museum. They chose their destination and bought a ticket using old pennies (not 2p coins!) and had their ticket clipped (not scanned!). Some of the children enjoyed dressing up as guards and they all helped to dust a carriage ready for inspection and sorted the "Passenger Luggage in Advance" so it went to the right destination.

All of this was before they even got to ride on a steam train! What a journey that was! Under bridges, over roads, through tunnels (not too many screams!) and twice they got to see the engine running around so it could pull the carriages back again.



Have you seen Tax-Free Childcare (TFC) - What is it?

Government support for **working parents**, including the self-employed, in the UK working at least 16 hours at the National Minimum Wage. For children aged 0-11 or until 16 if disabled.

(Preschool/ Breakfast/Afterschool/Holiday Club)

- Parents and carers can earn up to £100k each per year and still be eligible for TFC.

 For every £8 a parent pays into an online account, the government will add an extra £2.
 Up to £2,000 per child per year or £4,000 each year if the child has a disability.
 This is for parents who aren't receiving Tax Credits, Universal Credit, or childcare vouchers.

Setting up an account and payments

- Parents apply for an account through: childcarechoices.gov.uk.

- HMRC confirm via email, and you can set up their TFC account.
- Accounts can be opened at any time of the year and can be used straight away.

- Parents search for provider in the 'Your Tax-Free Childcare account' section of the account homepage by name, address, postcode. (Niton Preschool, School Lane, Niton PO38 2BP)

- Parents pay money into the TFC account. The top up will be added automatically.

- The government top-up is applied to deposits made for each child, not household.

Parents can get up to £500 every 3 months (up to £2,000 a year) for each child to help with the costs of childcare.


- Parents pay the childcare provider directly through the childcare account using bank transfer.

- For every £8 a parent pays into this account, the government will pay in £2 to use to pay the provider.

- Parents can use Tax Free Child to pay for additional childcare costs:
