This week, I had a Y5 pupil come along to show me the progress he had made with his handwriting since the beginning of September. He had recognised this himself, and was understandably very proud. Identifying progress and achievement in your own work, including what you have done well, what you need to do next, what you have learnt and how you learnt it, is a valuable part of the learning process (metacognition). Well done, and I look forward to seeing more children at my door!





Following our successful Harvest Festival, we received an email from the **Isle of Wight Foodbank** thanking the school community for their generous donations. Your donation weighed in at 59.04kg. With your help, they have fed 526 people in the last month, including 221 children. Well done, and thank you.

Each year, we take part in the **Remembrance Service** on 11th, organised by the Royal British Legion. As the 11th falls at the weekend this year, we have been asked if any families would like to come along to the family-friendly Remembrance Service on Sunday 12th November. my name.



1932. After the Great War took both her beloved brother and her fiancé, Violet Speedwell has become a "surplus woman," one of a generation doomed to a life of spinsterhood after the war killed so many young men. Yet Violet cannot reconcile herself to a life spent caring for her grieving, embittered mother. She saves enough to move out of her mother's place and into the town of Winchester. There, Violet is drawn into a society of broderers--women who embroider kneelers for the Cathedral, carrying on a centuries-long tradition of bringing comfort to worshippers. Violet finds support and community in the group. But when forces threaten her new independence and another war appears on the horizon, Violet must fight to put down roots in a place where women aren't expected to grow. This is a timeless story of friendship, love, and a woman crafting her own life.



Not everything online is reliable. People online are strangers and you can't always trust everything they say.






