Dear parents, carers and children,

This week saw our annual **Harvest Festival** take place in the garden of The Rectory, led by Reverend Jackie. Parents, grandparents and carers joined us for this fun celebration. Each class took to the stage (aka the patio) and we saw Harvest-themed riddles, poems and songs, which were fantastic! All the children joined in with rousing home-made versions of Thank You Lord and He's Got the Whole World in His Hands (there seemed to be a bit of a chicken-theme taking place as well...!) and children presented their very generous donations for the Food Bank. Our new EARA group had their first meeting last week. We welcomed back some members from last year's group, as well as some new members. We explored and reminded ourselves of the meaning of each word in the title (Equality and Rights Advocates) and discussed the Equality Act and human rights. We celebrated all the actions that were achieved last year, and talked about the meaning behind the pictures in the poster. KS2 children had a real treat today with a talk from Charles Dickens' great, great grandson, **Ian Dickens**. He gave us a fascinating insight into his early childhood. Many people didn't know that his father and all his family were sent to a debtors' prison and the 8 year old Charles Dickens was sent out to work as a 'blacker' who mixed boot polish. It was these early childhood traumas that shaped his writing and turned him into a world wide success. He was incredibly engaging and spoke passionately about writing and how easy it is to get your ideas down on paper as all it requires is a piece of A4 and a pen! He also encouraged the children to have a read of some of Charles Dickens' novels. Charles had happy memories of holidays on the Isle of Wight and, to celebrate 175 years since his birth, the Year 5s on the



Isle of Wight are invited to write a short story (500 words) on any topic. The runners up and winners will have their stories read by another great, great grandson and receive a fistful of book tokens to spend. As a bonus, the winner's school will receive the child's height in books for our library. Watch this space!

Reminder

As part of our wider curriculum actions to develop, prepare and empower children to become global citizens, there are opportunities for children to engage in leadership and school community roles. This week, we invited the Y6 children to apply for Y6 leadership roles, including the Pupil Leadership Team, Hive Captains, Sports Captains, Sports Crew, Librarians and Buddies. To ensure the process is inclusive, children can apply through writing a letter, preparing a PPT presentation, creating a video or presenting their verbal application in person. I have already received some applications, and I look forward to receiving some more on Monday, which is the deadline.
