Learning and Achieving Through Love, Courage and Respect

Dear parents, carers and children,

Thank you to those who were able to come along to **parents evening** this week. This was a good opportunity to talk about your child's progress and attainment, as well as their next steps. However, as always, if you have any queries at any other points between parents evenings, please do not hesitate to contact the school. You can email your child's class teacher (they will aim to reply within 3 days). However, if it is more urgent, please contact the school office.



You may have heard about the blue post-it notes! As part of our Promoting Positive Behaviour policy, we have high **behaviour expectations**, and children know that low-level behaviour (such as not listening when they should be) isn't acceptable as it doesn't reflect our school values, or ensure that all learning time is effective. We have introduced the use of blue post-it notes as part of our process. If children have already been told or reminded once but they continue, their name is then written on a blue post-it note and given to Mrs Jones as Behaviour Lead. Mrs

Jones then has a restorative conversation with them during part of play or lunchtime about any possible reasons for their behaviour, how it might impact on themselves and others, how they could improve it and how we can help them with this. These procedures are in our policy, and the post-it notes act as a visual reminder. We have had positive feedback about it so far, as lessons run much more smoothly and children are much more able to focus on their learning and show our school values. This is all alongside the use of positive praise and other strategies that are already in place.

Yesterday, we held a **whole school pupil conferencing** session, during which subject leaders met with groups of children from Y1-Y6 to talk about their learning in each subject. I met with children to talk about English, and I loved their enthusiasm. However, it is one of my favourite parts of the job when children also share their learning with me 'off the cuff'. This afternoon, Christopher in Y5 came to me to tell me about a story he has written. Well, it's more of a riddle, asking the reader to work out the name of the footballer. It is written in the second person (he is talking to the reader).

He read it to me, but, not being a football fan, I couldn't work out the name. I had to call on someone who might - Mr Lennon - who helped me out. The story is on p4. Can you work out who Christopher has written about?!



Year 1 and 2 have been discussing the question "What was life like in Grandma's day?" in their History unit. They've been lucky enough to have visits from Adah the storyteller via Zoom, then Tracy, William's Granny, and Sylvia, Rufus' Grandma, came in to talk to them and share their memories. They've focused on technology and the children have been so surprised to find out that there were only three TV channels 50 years ago, that phones had to be plugged into the wall, and



that there really weren't any computers at home.

It was Road Safety Week this week, and Mr Randini came in to present his **Road Safety Magic Show** to the whole school throughout the morning. There was lots of laughter coming from the school hall. Ask your children how they can keep safe near and on roads.


