









English		Maths					
<p>In our English lessons, we will continue to focus on grammar and punctuation, using The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar from Grammarsaurus. We will continue to learn about subject/verb single-clause sentences. Y2 will then further develop this by using co-ordinating conjunctions to join clauses. After that, we will be reading The Night Gardener, exploring the vocabulary used before writing a descriptive passage. We will then watch the short animation Taking Flight, where we will explore the narrative and characters, before rewriting a small section of it.</p> <p>Our RWI lessons will continue daily, as well as Reading lessons in which we will read and discuss a variety of picture books and poems, and develop our vocabulary and comprehension.</p>		<p>Year 1 In Year 1 we will return to place value, extending our understanding to numbers between 20 and 50. We will begin to count and group in multiples of tens and to partition into tens and ones. We will then move onto measurement, looking at length, height, mass, capacity and volume.</p> <p>Year 2 In Year 2 we will continue to learn about multiplication and division, learning about the 5 and 10 times tables. We will then move onto measurement, looking at height and length, mass, capacity and temperature.</p>					
<p>Science</p> <p>Uses of Everyday Materials We will be looking at objects and the materials from which they are made. We will consider how different materials are suited to different purposes, considering whether they are transparent, absorbent, flexible, magnetic, and also how strong they are. The children will be able to test materials for different purposes and begin to gather simple results to help us discuss what we have found out from our investigation. We will also find out how the shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.</p>		<p>Year 1 and 2 Bumble Bee Class Topic Web</p>  <p>Spring 2 2025</p>		<p>History</p>  <p>Our History topic this half term takes us back almost 200 years to the lives of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole. We will be investigating who they were and why they were significant individuals. We will use a variety of sources to learn about both ladies, and find out what they did that made such a difference. We will also discuss who we think is the most significant and why.</p>			
<p>Design & Technology</p> <p>In DT we will be investigating making pivots and linkages to create a moving dragon.</p> 	<p>Computing</p> <p>We will listen to a variety of pieces of music and consider how music can make them think and feel. The children will compare creating music digitally and non-digitally. They will look at patterns and purposefully create music.</p> 	<p>Music</p> <p>Our Music theme this half is structure. We will be learning about rhythms and beats through the theme of myths and legends. We will begin to think about how beats, half beats and rest beats look and sound in music, before composing our own pieces.</p> 	<p>PSHE</p> <p>In PSHE, we will be looking at citizenship. We will begin by looking at rules and the different roles people play in their communities. We will move onto the importance of looking after our school and wider environments.</p> 	<p>PE</p> <p>In PE this half term, we will be using our bodies in lots of different ways to exercise.</p> 	<p>RE</p> <p>In RE, we are exploring the theme 'Remembering' and why Jewish people remember Passover.</p>
