<p><u>Boudica's Army</u> <u>Persuasive speech</u> Children will explore the life of Kassy, a young girl from the lceeni tribe, and learn about her family, animals, and way of life. Through role-play activities, they will imagine what it was like living under Roman rule. Using persuasive language, they will write and perform speeches to convince the tribe either to fight the Romans or to make peace. This will help them build confidence, understand different points of view, and learn about life in the past.</p> <p><u>Narrative</u> They will then rewrite part of Kassy's story, learning how to punctuate direct speech correctly and will use conjunctions to improve the flow and detail of their writing.</p>		<p><u>Fractions</u> The children will be continuing with their exploration of fractions. They will be adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers. They will be exploring fractions of an amount and non-unit fractions of an amount before problem solving using their fractions knowledge.</p> <p><u>Decimals</u> The children will be exploring tenths and hundredths in detail- using a variety of methods (number lines, place value charts). They will explore halves and quarters as decimals and making the whole. They will compare, order and partition decimals, round to the nearest whole number and divide by 10 and 100.</p> <p><u>Measurement – Mass and Volume</u> Children measure mass in kg and g. They will weigh objects using scales, so that they can understand what a given number of grams/kilograms can look or feel like. Children will work out missing intervals between numbers on different scales. Children will use the units of litres and millilitres to measure capacity and volume.</p>

<p><u>Living Things and their Habitats</u> They will explain how environmental changes can impact living things, identify why certain species have become endangered and explain what humans are doing to help.</p> 						<p><u>The Romans in Britain</u> Children will explore the Roman Empire, focusing on the successful invasion of Britain led by Emperor Claudius. They will learn about the reasons behind the Roman invasion and examine the varied responses of the native Britons. The topic will also cover key Roman achievements and their impact on Britain. As part of our learning, we will visit Brading Roman Villa to gain firsthand insight into daily life under Roman rule on the Isle of Wight.</p>

<p><u>Eating Seasonally</u> Children will learn that fruits and vegetables grow in different countries based on their climates. They will understand that seasonal fruits and vegetables grow in a given season and that eating seasonal fruit and vegetables positively affects the environment. They will design a tart recipe using seasonal ingredients.</p> 	<p>This half term the children are exploring the theme of transition, preparing to move onto their next classes and year groups ready for September.
