<p><u>Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar - Grammarsaurus</u></p> <p>Before we move on to the English writing units, we will be using a program called The Place Value of Punctuation and Grammar which focuses on securing the basic grammar principles in English. This term, the children will look at what common, collective, partitive and proper nouns are, as well as securing their knowledge on subjects, verbs and sentence building. We will also be developing and improving our handwriting.</p> <p>In Reading we shall be using the picture book, Windows, to explore how homes and settlements change through time.</p>		<p><u>Number and place value</u></p> <p>Y3 - Count in 4s, 8s, and 50s from 0, and in 10s and 100s from any number; Recognise the place value of three-digit numbers; Compare and order numbers up to 1000; Identify, represent, and estimate numbers shown in different ways.</p> <p>Y4 - Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25, and 1000; Find 1000 more or less than a given number; Count backwards into negative numbers; Recognise the place value of four-digit numbers; Order and compare numbers beyond 100.</p>

<p><u>Light</u></p> <p>We will be identifying different sources of light - natural and artificial - before focusing on the sun - exploring the differences between night and day and learning why the sun rises and sets each day.</p> <p>We will investigate what shadows are, why they are formed, and how they behave. We will conduct a shadow investigation and plot our findings on a bar chart.</p> <p>Finally, we will explore how light is reflected from surfaces.</p>	<p>Exploring Settlements</p>		<p><u>Are all settlements the same?</u></p> <p>We will be exploring the UK and finding out about different regions, comparing towns, villages and cities and contrasting life in New Delhi, India. Children will gain familiarity with simple map notation and learn to follow a route around the locality.</p>

<p><u>Egyptian Scrolls</u></p> <p>In preparation for our Ancient Civilizations topic next half term, we will be immersing ourselves in Egyptian art. We will be looking at people's similarities and differences and respecting difference as a positive thing.</p>	<p><u>Connecting Computers</u></p> <p>We will be understanding how digital devices function, understanding how computer networks share information, and recognising the physical components of a network.</p>	<p><u>Glockenspiel</u></p> <p>We will be learning how to play the glockenspiel with Mrs Jackaman. We will learn different musical terminology.</p>	<p>On Wednesday the children will be doing tag rugby with Mr Goldsmith and on Friday they will be covering a range of indoor athletic skills from relay, javelin and running.</p>
