The Christmas Choir had their first performance at Brighstone Grange on Wednesday after school. Their performance was amazing, and they brought happy tears to the residents, who were bopping along to the carols. We were very proud of the children. They have a few more performances coming up over the next few days. This weekend, they will be singing at four different venues: Mottistone church and the BSA Christmas Fair tomorrow, and the IOW Pearl and the Stars of concert in St Mary's Church on Sunday. Not only that, but some members of the community who access Parklands in Cowes will be visiting us next week to see our choir sing. I think our choristers will need to rest their voices after all this!





On Monday, I took Bumble Bee class over to St Mary's Church as part of our RE learning journey, in which we are exploring Light as a Symbol: Hanukkah and Advent. To start our learning journey, we thought about when we use candles, including on birthday cakes, at Christmas, to relax and to remember people. We lit a candle in the church and everyone had a moment of reflection in which they thought of someone or something that they wanted to remember. The children were very thoughtful and respectful. On our way out of the church, we were then amazed and in awe of the wonderful mosaics that have been created for the Christmas Tree Festival. Please do go and see them for yourself in the vestibule.

Talking of the Christmas Tree Festival, all of our children have created a decoration for our tree. To celebrate reading and writing, KS1 and KS2 have drawn the front cover of their favourite book, and some have written the blurb on the back. Reception class have decorated paper pencils to celebrate writing (they have been doing some amazing writing in class!).





On Wednesday evening, to start the Christmas Tree Festival, our head pupils, Flo, Hugh, Martha and Henry, had the honour of lighting the tree outside the church. It was a slightly shaky start when nothing happened at first, but luckily the lights then sprang to life and everyone cheered! We then joined the rest of the congregation in the church for the Lights of Love service. Our head pupils were delighted to have VIP seats with laminated name labels!

Amen.










Golden Book

Respect Charter

at Brighstone CE Aided Primary School

At Brighstone CE Aided Primary School we believe staff, parents and children are entitled to a safe and protective environment in which to learn and work. We strive to ensure that our school offers a warm and nurturing environment. All members of the school community and visitors should demonstrate mutual respect, to feel safe, work together and to use restorative approaches as the foundation of our practice. Any behaviour that may lead to feelings of harassment, alarm or distress to members of our community, will not be tolerated and action taken.

Expectations

- That all adults set a good example to children at all times, showing them how to get along with all members of the school and the wider community.
- That no one staff, governors, parents, carers, volunteers or children - be subjected to abusive behaviour or any form of threats from visitors on the school premises.
- That physical attacks and threatening behaviour, abusive or insulting language verbal or written (including on social media), to staff, governors, parents, carers, volunteers, children and other users of the school premises will not be tolerated and may lead to a ban from school premises and/or police action.

Types of behaviour that are considered serious and unacceptable

This is not an exhaustive list but seeks to provide illustrations of such behaviour:

- a Shouting, either in person or over the telephone
- Speaking in an aggressive/threatening tone
- o Physically intimidating, e.g. standing very close
- The use of aggressive hand gestures/exaggerated
- Physical threats
- Shaking or holding a fist towards another person
- Swearing and name calling
- Pushing
- Slapping, punching, hitting or kicking
- Racist, homophobic or other hateful behaviour
- Sexist comments or sexual innuendo
- Disrespecting religion or belief
- Inappropriate communications (posting on Social Networking sites, emails or letters, etc.) which could bring the school into disrepute or be deemed as bullying, harassment and/or a hate-related

The school reserves the right to take any necessary actions to ensure that members of the school community are not subjected to any form of abuse in line with policy and procedure. If you choose to engage in these behaviours you may be asked to leave the site or the police may be called.
